Jakarta EE 11 Update

 - Considering/likely to use Hibernate as a compatible implementation within GlassFish (Hibernate is passing many of the tests)

- GlassFish community has raised a concern with the above
- Open issue to be worked out w/in GlassFish community
- Need to initiate testing of the refactored Platform TCK with GlassFish
- Based on delays of some component spec ballots, and potential continuation of the delay pattern, may need to change the "June/July" target to "July/August" (this is not a statement of delay, just acknowledging the possibility).
- From Shabnam: The Marketing committee requires a minimum of 6 weeks to be able to prepare properly for the launch of release-related marketing activities.
 - Request: Can we get a confirmation for the release date of 16 July (the current expected release date) by the end of the month?
 - Ed and Arjan will confirm/deny this date by May 31st

Jakarta EE – Future Vision Initiative [was: Beyond Jakarta EE 11]

Neil Patterson provided an update on this initiative on March 26 (see below).

The <u>working document</u> has been updated/replaced with a new one that better organizes the material, defines the steps and status of each, and provides some

guidance on the responsibilities for the various ideas that were generated. From the <u>document</u>, the following outlines these steps and progress.

- [Complete] Brainstorm about directions we should take Jakarta EE after release 11 is out. This will involve working sessions with the Steering Committee, Spec Committee, Marketing Committee and member organizations.
- 2. [Complete] Generate a working document that will influence the next generation of specs, messaging, content, and more.
- 3. [In Progress] Integrate top ideas into the technical survey to gather feedback.
- 4. [In Progress] Deliver specification and working group recommendations to relevant committees.
- 5. [In Progress] Form an <u>interest group</u> (Name TBD) to prioritize and explore the topics in greater detail, especially those beyond the typical Jakarta EE scope. Initial participation interest: Microsoft, Payara, IBM, Oracle. Tomitribe
