 - Ed will push for getting the Core Profile TCK released so that we can get a ratifying compatible implementation certified right away.

The Jakarta EE Working Group Elections for Enterprise Member Representatives on all three committees closed on Friday, October 4th, and we are pleased to announce the following elected representatives for 2024-2025:

Steering Committee Representatives: Reza Rehman, Microsoft Jun Qian, Primeton Information Technologies, Inc

Specification Committee Representatives: Jun Qian, Primeton Information Technologies, Inc Zhai Luchao, Shandong Cvicse Middleware Co., Ltd

Marketing and Brand Committee Representatives: Reza Rahman, Microsoft Eric Meng, Primeton Information Technologies, Inc As a reminder, Marcin Kruglik (Steering Committee), and Marcelo Ancelmo (Specification Committee) were acclaimed to the roles of Participant Member Representatives. The Participant Member Representative seat for the Marketing & Brand Committee remains vacant.

Additionally, Wener Keil (Specification Committee) and Otavio Santana (Marketing & Brand Committee) were acclaimed to the roles of Committer Member Representatives. The Committer Member Representative seat for the Steering Committee remains vacant. Elected representatives, like every other member of the committee, have the responsibility and obligation of directly defining and implementing the working group's charter. Working group committees require quorum and regularly vote on matters pertaining to the working group. As a result, elected representatives are required to be in regular attendance at meetings. You can read more in the Working Group Operations Guide under Committee Representatives.

CY2025 Program Planning (40 minutes)

- The Eclipse Foundation has provided calendar guidance for CY2025 Program Planning
- The process for CY2025 Working Group program planning should begin during September
- Folder with the 2025 planning files
- On September 24, we agreed to conduct a retrospective on performance vs. the CY2024 plan as a first step in CY2025 planning. There was consensus on this suggestion.
 - Tanja sent out a copy of the <u>Comments for Retrospective 2024 Jakarta EE</u> <u>Program Plan</u> to capture Steering Committee member input prior to today's meeting
- The intent of the retrospective was to cover the following in order (see retrospective reference):
 - Step 1: Set the tone
 - Step 2: Gather feedback (will review slides for comments)
 - Step 3: Generate insights (patterns and trends)
 - Step 4: Create action items (esp for CY2025 Program Planning)
 - Step 5: Close out the retrospective
- The group began the discussion on Oct 8 but did not complete the review of all strategic goals in the CY2024 plan.
- We agreed to hold a special meeting of the Steering Committee on October 15 to complete the review and take next steps in the program planning process.
- Some comments on the Retrospective and the Program Planning process prior to today's discussion:
 - Thanks to those who have provided comments in the <u>Comments for</u> <u>Retrospective - 2024 Jakarta EE Program Plan</u>. It is useful to capture perspectives on performance vs. the CY2024 Plan as part of the CY2025 Planning process. Having started this process, we should complete it.
 - Please bear in mind the schedule on slide 13 of the <u>2025 Program Plan Process</u> <u>deck</u>. We need a Draft Program Plan approved by late October.
 - It has not been a goal of the annual Planning Process to define specifics of future Jakarta EE release content or schedules. Requirements to resolve such questions as part of the CY2025 Planning Process would need to have been raised months ago and were not. Such questions, IMO, are not resolvable, at this time, within CY2025 Planning Process timelines.
 - This is not to say that such issues should not be raised. For issues, such as the above, that are not susceptible to resolution (IMO) during the CY2025 Program Planning schedule, I believe that we should identify, as part of our Program Plan, goals to resolve these issues in specific timeframes, and/or through specific processes. In the case of Jakarta EE release plans, the Jakarta EE Future Directions Interest Group offers a natural process for such discussions, and we should use it.

- I think Kenji has made valid comments about the slip in Jakarta EE 11. Although Platform TCK refactoring is a one-time event, we should have a goal related to release process improvement to better identify and manage release risks.
- The above comments from Will Lyons were reviewed
- The review and discussion of CY2024 goals was completed
 - All members were invited to capture their comments directly in <u>Comments for</u> <u>Retrospective - 2024 Jakarta EE Program Plan</u>
 - There was insufficient time to recap the discussion the following comments are intended to summarize the discussion:
 - There was general consensus that we should reduce the number of strategic goals, and apply more focus and direction to the primary goals, such as:
 - Deliver Future Jakarta EE Specification Releases
 - Increase Jakarta EE Brand Awareness & Adoption
 - Grow Contributors and Reward Committers
 - Grow Working Group Membership
 - There remains a difference in perspective on the degree to which the Steering Committee should attempt to define, as part of the CY2025 Program Planning Process by early November, the content of future Jakarta EE releases within the goal "Deliver Future Jakarta EE Specification Releases"
 - Will Lyons offered to draft CY2025 goals that he believes would help form consensus from Committee on the CY2025 plan
 - This would not include the content of future Jakarta EE releases
 - Reza Rahman offered to draft more specific goals wrt to the content of future Jakarta EE releases
 - If there were committee consensus on these goals they could be included in the CY2025 plan
